

paani FLOOD RELIEF REPORT

MONSOON SEASON

In the summer of 2020, Pakistan suffered from a traumatic flash flood in the province of Sindh. More than 200 villages were affected due to large rainfalls in District Dadu. The rain killed and destroyed livestock and crops. On August 27th, 2020, the city received more than 223mm of rain in a 12-hour period, the country's meteorological department said, the highest seen in a single day since records began. Hundreds of villagers were left without housing, food, or clean water. In Karachi, many families who had hand pumps suffered from gutter water seeping into these wells, providing no clean water for these families. Many families also had to evacuate to move to safer areas.



DISASTER RELIEF

With disaster relief as part of Paani's mission to help the people of Pakistan, Paani raised over \$26,000 in order to help alleviate the worsening flood conditions in Interior Sindh and Karachi. Thanks to our generous donors, Paani provided emergency aid with food, hygiene kits, assistance with debris removal, and proper drinking water provisions with storage.



EXECUTION PLAN

The emergency aid was distributed in two phases:

Phase 1: Distribute hot cooked meals to those in need in the Karachi area. In interior Sindh, Paani opted to distribute food packages.

Phase 2: After renting multiple water tankers, Paani provided each individual with 2-gallon bottles filled with clean water to alleviate the desperate need for clean water.
